



Gdańsk, Poland: July 27 to August 6, 2020



Canadian Contingent Information

Participants

Age: All Scouting and Guiding youth between 14 to 18 years old (Scouts and Guides who will be 14 years old on and before July 26, 2020, and not 19 before the close of the Jamboree on August 6, 2020).

Numbers: European Jamboree 2020 (EJ2020) is limited to 15,000 on site.

Patrols: Participants will be in patrols of 10 = 8 Youth + 2 Scouters 18 years and older (changed from 9 youth and 1 Scouter on April 11, 2020, as decided by Scouts Canada).

Units: There will be 4 patrols in each unit, totalling 32 youth + 8 Scouters. If groups cannot form a complete patrol on their own, or if an adult or youth is coming alone, don't worry: we will place you in a patrol.

Subcamps: There will be 8 subcamps of approximately 1800 people. 7 of them will be for participants, and 1 will be ISTs. Units from the same country will NOT be placed in the same subcamp in order to encourage mixing, mingling, and making new friends, and to promote cultural diversity. This means that the Canadian Contingent will be split between 2 or 3 subcamps, 4 patrols/1 unit per subcamp.

Each subcamp is like a mini city and is where much of daily life takes place. Each subcamp will have a team and one leader, akin to a city council and a mayor. Each subcamp will have its own support centre, information centre, lost and found, unit leader meetings, first aid points, "listening ears" centres for ISTs, daily updates and meetings, and gathering places.

Dates: Patrols arrive on July 27 and are asked to depart the morning of August 7, the day after the closing ceremonies on August 6.

Cost for a participant: **\$725 CAD**. This price includes all cooking equipment, dining shelters, tables and benches, food, and the entire program of activities ON and OFF the jamboree site,

any first aid or minor surgery administered at the onsite hospital, transport to and from the airport/ferry/train station, and a participation pack (including necker and badge)

* The fee DOES NOT include airfare, personal equipment such as mess kits, sleeping bags, tents, or contingent gear (necker, badges, shirts, etc.), hospital visits, or any medication (even if given at the onsite hospital), or repatriation

Registration Process and Deadlines:

1. Interested youth and adults in full patrols, partial patrols, or even as individuals complete a preliminary registration at <https://www.scouterresources.ca/eurojam-registration> as soon as possible.
2. All incoming registrations are sorted into patrols on an ongoing basis, first come, first served
3. Once a patrol has been formed and verified to be complete, its members will be asked to forward their 10% installment payment to reserve a spot at EJ2020.
4. The Canadian Contingent will officially register all of these complete patrols on September 30, 2019 and Oct 28, 2019. No further participants will be accepted after Oct 28, 2019.

Although the ultimate registration deadline is December 31, 2019, it may very well close before, as it becomes capped/closed when a maximum number of 15,000 participants.

Therefore, it is advisable to register at <https://www.scouterresources.ca/eurojam-registration> ASAP.

Airfare: Airfare is not included in registration. All participants and ISTs will be responsible for booking their own airfare unless we use a travel agent. All participants, ISTs, and their families can expect a 10% discount, whether we choose to go through an agent to receive a 10% discount as part of a Group Rate, or use the Air Canada-affiliated Conference Rate by applying

for a booking code (we essentially become our own booking agent and enter this code to receive an automatic discount). The Conference Rate is extendable up to 7-14 days before and after the date of the jamboree and should cover every group's travel windows for exploring Europe before or after EJ2020.

Ground Transport: Participants arriving by plane (Gdańsk Lech Wałęsa International Airport (GDN)), train (Gdansk Główny railway station) or ferry (Gdynia ferry terminal) will be provided with transport by Jamboree buses or trains (JTS – Jamboree Transport System) first to the Check-In Centre at the Amber Expo (in full patrols) and then by buses to the campsite. Transfer by Jamboree coaches and trains will be available only from assigned entry points. This transport is included in the Jamboree fee.

Travel before or after EJ2020: to be decided by Patrols and SC Groups travelling together, with support from the Canadian Contingent team and the EJ2020 travel assistance team. One team member per registered patrol—and a senior youth is perfectly able to be the representative—should be chosen as the sole correspondent with the EJ2020 travel team so as to keep the process clean.

ISTs (“International Service Team”, independent adult volunteers)

Age: Adult Scouters, Scouts, and Guides who are at least 18 years old on July 26, 2020 are welcome to join the IST. IST members should be able to communicate in English and be ready to perform any tasks necessary for the Jamboree.

Numbers: So far, there is no limitation to the number of ISTs that can register as part of the Canadian Contingent, but the EJ2020 organizing committee reserves the right to limit IST numbers if all volunteer positions are filled, or if the maximum total of 15,000 attendees is reached.

Dates: ISTs **must** arrive on July 25 and depart on August 8: arriving 2 days before and departing 2 days after the jamboree to assist in set-up, complete on-site training, and help break-down/clean-up.

Cost for an IST: **\$470 CAD**. As with participants, this price includes all cooking equipment, dining shelters, tables and benches, food, any first aid or minor surgery administered at the onsite hospital, transport to and from the airport/ferry/train station, a participation pack (including necker and badge), and the entire program of activities ON the jamboree site,

* The fee DOES NOT include airfare, personal equipment such as mess kits, sleeping bags, tents, or contingent gear (neckers, badges, shirts, etc.), hospital visits, or any medication (even if given at the onsite hospital), or repatriation. It also does not include excursions OFF the site the jamboree site. Those excursions are only covered for participants.

Registration Process and Deadlines:

1. Interested ISTs complete a preliminary registration at <https://www.scouteresources.ca/eurojam-registration> as soon as possible.
2. After receiving further information and a position catalogue, IST volunteers complete an online application for service, choosing their favourite three positions.
3. Applications are examined by the EJ2020 organizers, sorted, and then sent back to the Canadian Head of Contingent for approval.
4. ISTs can apply up to be part of the Canadian Contingent until December 1, 2019

Airfare, Ground Transport, travel before and after EJ2020: Same as participant info

Training: All IST members must complete the online “Safe from Harm” training course prior to their arrival, and an induction training for their specific area of work when they arrive on site. During the Jamboree, the Planning Team will organize a space serving as an “IST Centre”, where ISTs will have an opportunity to find answers to their questions, solve their problems or talk to volunteers known as “Listening Ears”.

Other Expenses and Considerations for EVERYONE

Healthcare and Repatriation: All participants and IST volunteers will have emergency first aid access and treatment covered as part of their fee. A tripled network of: 1) patrolling first aid responders; 2) first aid stations for mild wound care; and 3) an outpost aid station for more serious concerns not necessitating hospitalization has been planned. The outpost clinic will

have general medicine, treatment room, and intensive care areas staffed by doctors, nurses, and first responders in 12-hour shifts. *If you are a doctor, nurse, or first responder and would like to assist in this area, please let Scouter Heather know.*

While treatment onsite is free (aside from medicine), please note that any *hospital or hospital fees are not included*, and as such, all travellers much have health insurance to cover these fees should hospital visits offsite be deemed necessary. *Prescription medication* is also not covered. Please come with extra supplies of any prescription medications you may need. *Medical care due to pre-existing health conditions are not covered*, so please make sure you are covered by your own insurance. In the very unfortunate event of death abroad, please make sure you have repatriation insurance. *Repatriation*, the transport of your body back home, is extremely expensive, and not a cost anyone wishes to have to think about!

Cancelation insurance: If the Jamboree is cancelled by the organizers prior to its beginning, fees *will* be refunded. If the jamboree starts and is cancelled halfway through, fees *will not* be refunded. Participants are strongly encouraged to make sure their airfare, train tickets, and pother transport is refundable, as transport is NOT insured by the organizers.

Visas and Passports: All travellers must have valid visas and/or passports.

Arriving early or leaving late: Any type of homestays or exchanges to accommodate early arrivals or late leavers is not supported by the jamboree per se. They have, however, created a tourism team to assist us find places to visit before or after EJ2020, and as such, this resource can be utilized to make connections with scouts overseas.

Food: With proper notice, all food requirements and special needs can certainly be accommodated. Everyone is being given pre-loaded food cards upon arrival, and patrols can shop at food stores throughout the site and choose what they wish to cook for their meals.

Special Needs: The European Jamboree, in the spirit of inclusiveness, encourages any participant with special needs that can be accommodated to attend. If the attendee would benefit from one-on-one support, that attendee can bring an adult support, and be placed into a patrol of 8 youth and 2 adults, one adult being the integration helper.

Safety and Security: In addition to all Scouts Canada rules and regulations, the EJ2020 team has put additional safety measures in place. All youth and adults must sign a Code of Conduct which will be strictly upheld. Youth and adults will sleep in separate subcamps. In addition to valid Respect in Sport Child and Youth Safety training, all Scouts Canada ISTs must complete a "Safe from Harm" course offered online in English by the ZHP, who will pay for this training.

Alcohol and any drugs are prohibited and smoking sections are designated onsite, away from youth. No drones of any type are permitted without advance permission from the Head of the Safety and Security Team. No private vehicles are allowed onsite. The EJ2020 team hopes this will be a cash free event with all purchases done with a prepaid card given to each participant. A Safety and Security team will be patrolling and monitoring all events, and police and fire departments will also be volunteering at the event in coordination with the municipal offices of the city of Gdansk. An emergency crisis management centre will also be active and ready to act and protect all 15,000 people at the jamboree.

Offsite excursion during the jamboree: All participants will have an excursion to Gdansk included in their registration fee, as noted under the “ACT” portion of the program further on in this document.

Special “IST Adventure”: From July 20-24, before the jamboree, the EJ2020 team projects that up to 25% of the ISTs will be able to participate in a pre-jamboree adventure, discovering Poland by bike, canoe, and on foot; discover Polish food and learn to cook it; and get to know other ISTs before the jamboree begins. The adventure themes are “Folk Route”, “Bike Jamboree”, “Survival Route”, “City Game”, “Adventure Route”, and “Wild Ponidzie”. These adventures are a chance for ISTs to play, rest, and meet new friends. Prices and registration will be open online from November 2019 until February 2020.

Amenities: Postal Service, WIFI, a jamboree shop (for any supplies you have forgotten or need to replace), and limited charging facilities (please limit your electronics use) will be available. Shipping goods by cargo overseas is possible and storage at the port of Gdansk is available for a 2-week period before and after the EJ2020.

We have one simple call for you – ACT!

Imagine Scouts and Guides not only talking about change, imagine Scouts and Guides joining the European Jamboree to ACT.

The programme will be based on three pillars:

1. **“Every Scout and Guide possesses potential to become a driver of social change. So come to the Jamboree to WAKE UP and discover your power! You will interACT with Scouts and Guides of various cultures, various languages and various countries.”** We want to WAKE UP Scouts and Guides and encourage them to challenge themselves, search for the skills they have and practice new ones. These elements of the programme will be based on **21st century skills**.
2. **“Use your time at the Jamboree to LOOK AROUND (the Global Goals will guide you), to learn through adventures, eye-opening discussions, and inspiring workshops”.** We want to look around carefully, so Scouts and Guides can gain the knowledge of exactly what is needed and be aware what to look for in their local communities and globally. This part of the programme will be based on the **Sustainable Global Goals**.
3. **“Using your skills and knowing where the helping hand is needed, ACT and make a change in the society. ACT wisely. ACT decisively.”** We want to encourage Scouts and Guides to be active, not to stay passive, reACT whenever it is needed. This part of the programme will be based on real **ACTion** of the Jamboree participants – **changemakers**.

Educational goals

- ▶ Encourage Scouts & Guides to discover their **potential for being changemakers**.
- ▶ Raise awareness of global issues and responsibility for local communities; gain knowledge on **how to ACT! being an active citizen of the world**.
- ▶ Raise awareness, develop skills and form attitudes to achieve the **goals of the UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development** through creating a learning environment for the future young leaders of local communities.
- ▶ In particular raise awareness about climate change; educate and give examples of how to contribute to global actions preventing more damage.
- ▶ Prepare a sustainable programme (in material usage) and work through the programme to eliminate the carbon footprint of the event.
- ▶ Build openness to other cultures and religions and support the **sense of kinship** to live in peace.
- ▶ Learn how to embrace challenges, **develop self-reliance, build self-confidence** and spark off the need for continuous **self-improvement**.
- ▶ Give an opportunity to experience the **unique adventure** on the Island of Sobieszewo.


Game overview

“The year is 2020, summer has arrived on the European Jamboree island. Warm sun beams are hiding behind the green horizon, the fresh sea breeze brings relief after a long day. You are admiring the beauty of nature. You would love it if future generations could enjoy the richness of the planet.

Our world consists of four elements: **earth** which brings goods, **water** that is crucial for all living creatures, clear **air** responsible for quality and **fire** representing energy but as well safety.

But planet is not in good condition. People are harming it. Different **ACTions** need to be taken before it will be too late to save the planet from ecological damages. The time to ACT has already begun.

If every person on the planet changes their habits it would make the difference. Will you help to save the planet and overcome further damages?”



Goal of the game

Save the planet. Do everything in your power.

Game basic rules

1. The more participants who take part in the game, the higher the chances of winning
2. The game has limited time

Game preparations – pre-Jamboree Task – launch in autumn 2019

During the European Jamboree 2020 we will invite participants to take part in a game, starting before the Jamboree (with a pre-Jamboree task), to a grand finale during Closing Ceremony. The game will take place on the Island, surrounded by four elements: earth, air, water and fire, closer to nature. The main goal of all the activities during the modular programme, camp life (cleaning, cooking etc.), will be part of the game. Guiding us all to ensure the Jamboree is sustainable as possible and encouraging everyone to ACT for the climate.
